Re-Enroll in 4-H Online

October 1st begins the new year in 4-H, which means it is time to re-enroll! All youth members, volunteers, and Cloverbuds will need to re-enroll to participate in 4-H again this year.

All youth can select the "Pay by Check" option and 4-H Council will cover the fee to enroll! Remember that enrolling by December 1st can be counted as one of your items on your auction eligibility!

This is also when new members can enroll in 4-H for the first time. Encourage your friends to join 4-H!

Volunteers in 4-H Online

We are updating our volunteer records over this next year and making sure that we are following 4-H Policy. All volunteers will need to re-enroll in 4-H Online and make sure to select the projects for which you are a volunteer or project leader.

If you are an adult volunteer that:

- is a club or project leader
- will take youth on overnight events as a chaperone or
- will hold programs without Extension agents present,

you will need to go through the screening process and complete a background check (if you have not done so in the last 3 years).

Meade County 4-H is seeking county-wide Project Leaders for the upcoming year to provide positive learning experiences for 4-H youth. With project leaders, we are better able to assist 4-Hers with project-based learning. If you have a passion for any 4-H projects, consider volunteering! - -work under the direction of the Meade County Agents with direction from the 4-H Youth Development Program Development Committee.
- -communicate with families enrolled in the project(s)
