Fair Entry

Families will use their 4-H Online Sign-In and password for this process. Make sure to click the correct fair! Our fair logo will show to make sure you are choosing the correct one. Make sure to enroll **ALL** kids before submitting.

Auction Eligibility Forms

Due July 14th, 2023

The date on the eligibility form was incorrect, so we will be accepting Auction Eligibility Forms until Friday, July 14th.

All youth wishing to sell an item in the food or livestock auction must fill out the Auction Eligibility form and turn it in to the office by July 14th. Your club leader must sign the form, so don't wait until the last minute! Download the form from our website: https://www.meade.k-state.edu/4-h/fair/fair.html or stop by the office.

Fair Set Up and Clean Up

Set Up: July 22nd 5:30 pm Clean Up: July 29th 10:00 am

After hearing some feedback from last year, we will have a specific day for both Fair Set Up before fair and Clean Up after fair this year. This way we can ensure that the fairgrounds get cleaned up and everything is returned to its place after all animals and exhibits are gone. This will also prevent us from rushing at the end of the auction. Both fair Set Up and Clean Up are required in order to get your premium money. If you are not able to attend both of these, you must contact the office by July 21st. We understand that people

have other commitments and take trips right after fair, but we would like as many people as possible to attend. The assignments for Set Up and Clean Up can be found on the next page.

Sale Packet Assignments

Sale Packets are at the office ready to be picked up and taken to businesses! Each 4-Her participating in the food or livestock auction will be assigned 1 or 2 businesses to take a sale packet to (depending on location). We will let you know what businesses you are assigned to when you pick up your packets. This year the sale packets have an RSVP card with them for the Buyers BBQ that you will hand the business owner/contact person. Please have them fill this card out and then bring it back to the office or text a picture of it to Hannah 620-629-5972 by July 21st. This helps us get an idea of who will attend the BBQ and make sure we are covering our local businesses. The more businesses you reach and the more people that come to the auction, the better the outcome is for you! Please see the next page for some suggestions when visiting businesses.



Delivering Sale Packets

Taking a Sale Packet to businesses in the area is a personal invitation to our Annual Fair BBQ and encourages potential buyers to come to our Cake & Pie and Livestock Sale. When visiting a business, this is an excellent time to practice your conversation skills and use what is called an "elevator pitch." An elevator pitch is basically a really fast summary about whatever it is you are involved with or supporting. In this case, your elevator pitch would be about your 4-H project(s) that you are bringing to the Meade County Fair.

When you are delivering your sale packet, here are some tips to help your conversation. Taking a moment to talk to the person you are delivering the packet to rather than just dropping it off will create a personal connection and might improve the chances of them coming to support!

- Introduce yourself if you don't already know them! Start with telling the person your name, what 4-H club you are in, and maybe what projects you participate in. You could also bring some pictures of your projects.
- Tell them what is in the packet. It includes a brochure about the auction, an invitation to the Fair BBQ, and 2 FREE tickets to the BBQ.
- Why should they come to the Fair BBQ? The BBQ is a meal for the community to gather at the end of the fair, right before our Cake & Pie and Livestock Sale. If they are interested, they can stay after the meal and support our local 4-Hers by participating in the auction.
- Ask them to fill out the RSVP card while you are there so that you can bring it back to the office.
- Thank them for their time!
- Consider taking a note with you in case the person you are trying to deliver the packet to is not in the office when you stop by. This way they know who left it and you can follow up with a phone call or another visit later to fill out the RSVP card.

As mentioned on the previous page, we have assigned each 4-Her to 1 or 2 businesses this year. You can always deliver a packet to other businesses that are not on our list if you would like! Stop by the office to pick up your packets! Please return the RSVP card to the office or send a picture of it to Hannah by July 21st.

Livestock Insurance & Stall Reservations

Due July 12th, 2023

You will fill out insurance and stall reservations on the same form. Insurance is optional and costs \$7/head. Payment must be submitted when you turn your form in. Download the form from our website: https://www.meade.k-state.edu/4-h/fair/fair.html or come in to the office to grab

Our livestock insurance policy covers the animal at market value once it leaves your property until the end of the fair on Friday. Please read the two policies on our website (link above) to see what losses specifically are covered.

Bred & Owned Contest

There has been a clarification on the Bred & Owned Contest. Rather than all animals born & raised in Meade county being eligible, animals now must be bred and owned by the <u>exhibitor</u>. Animals purchased from another producer will not qualify for this contest.



Poultry Testing

Reminder that Meade County is not scheduled for P-T testing until 2025, per the new testing rules.

State Fair Information

NEW 4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for Frostings & Fillings at the Kansas State Fair

Please note that there is a *NEW* 4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for the 2023 Kansas State Fair. The new rule is as follows: For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. Examples on how to calculate this percentage are included in the publication located at: https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/MF3544.pdf

Since this rule is not in our fair book yet, we will continue to go by our rules for the Meade County Fair. However, if you plan to take your food item to the state fair, you need to be aware of this rule.

Make sure to get entered if you are entering in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Your nominations make you eligible, but are not a show entry!
