

Code of Conduct Update

Kansas 4-H has updated the Code of Conduct that EACH member signs when enrolling for 4-H. The changes align with Kansas State University risk management and conduct standards, and will be implemented for the current 4-H year. The new form brings clarification of behavior expectations and help all parties in local extension units and at K-State move forward in the Kansas 4-H Youth Development mission.

Livestock Sale - Policy J2.2

It is important for all livestock project members to be aware of this rule! In simple terms, the policy state that if a NOMINATED animal (for Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show) is SOLD at any COUNTY FAIR auction, it becomes INELIGIBLE to be shown at the KSF or KJLS.

All <u>nominated livestock</u> that are sold in July at the fair are reported to the State 4-H Youth Livestock Department. Again, this policy only affects the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show.

48 Hours of 4-H Wrap Up & Thinking ahead

Thank you to everyone that helped with the 48 Hours of 4-H Weekend. We had a great turnout for the packing party and appreciate everyone that helped the day before as well. We have been asked what 4-H clubs can do to help even more with the 48 Hours of 4-H event. We work towards this packing party year round.

As 4-H members, or your club as a group, can help by: collecting school supplies, collecting new small stuffed animals, Barbie dolls, or tools (hammers, multi-head screwdrivers, pliers, and tape measures). You can save medicine bottles to be used for the nails and screws to put in the boxes with the tools.

You can also make fishing kits or sewing kits. We've seen these kits placed in medicine bottles as well. As a sewing project, you can make the flannel blankets for the baby dolls or make extra outfits for the Barbie dolls.

Many of you have attended workshops to make the tshirt jump ropes. It would be great to have dozens or hundreds of these jump ropes made to go in the boxes.

Finally, you or your club can fundraise for the shipping of the boxes. Each year, we raise \$9,000 in shipping money!

Many of you help with the 5K Fun Run, the bake sales and ice cream sales throughout the year for this project, but you are welcome to get creative and come up with your own fundraising ideas as well.
